Education foundation to bring back summer class program

Avon Education Foundation courses open to area adults

AVON-BY-THE-SEA — The Avon-by-the-Sea Education Foundation will continue its mission to bring educational and enrichment programs to the community by, once again, hosting summer classes open to area adults.

The classes, called the Adult "Try It" series, will cover a variety of topics, including navigating online social media to dance classes.

Last summer, the foundation held similar classes which taught residents several computer programs.

Michele Gioia, a foundation board member, said after the success of last year's summer classes, the foundation decided to bring them back again this summer.

Though the foundation also funds programs for children, she said it is just as important to host programs for adults.



"We are focused as much on adult education and enrichment as well as supporting the school," Mrs. Gioia said.

The classes are funded by proceeds of past fundraisers, she added.

Classes cost \$10 each for residents, and \$15 for non-residents.
